
"Landscape Policy for the Three Countries Park" (LP3LP)

The Statenzaal in the southernmost part of the Provincial Government buildings on the island.


You can reach the Statenzaal by walking around the main building over the bridge crossing the Papenwater (entrance 2).

The Three Countries Park and the LP3LP project

The Three Countries Park (3LP) is a collaborative effort of nine public partners in the Netherlands, Belgium and Germany. Their common aim is to preserve and to manage the countryside area around the so-called MHHAL cities (Maastricht, Hasselt, Heerlen, Aachen and Liège) in a sustainable manner. The area represents the "green heart of the Euregio Meuse-Rhine" and is characterised by a strong diversity between these major cities and the surrounding rural countryside, and blessed with a rich variety of cultural, historic, landscape, and natural values.

Its important landscape assets provide a strong added value for regional attractiveness. Nevertheless, a cross-border perspective is required to guide rapid landscape transformation such as counter urbanization, economic diversification or agricultural intensification. In that perspective the LP3LP project aims at developing a cross-border 3LP landscape policy for the preservation, development and management of the 3LP landscape.
